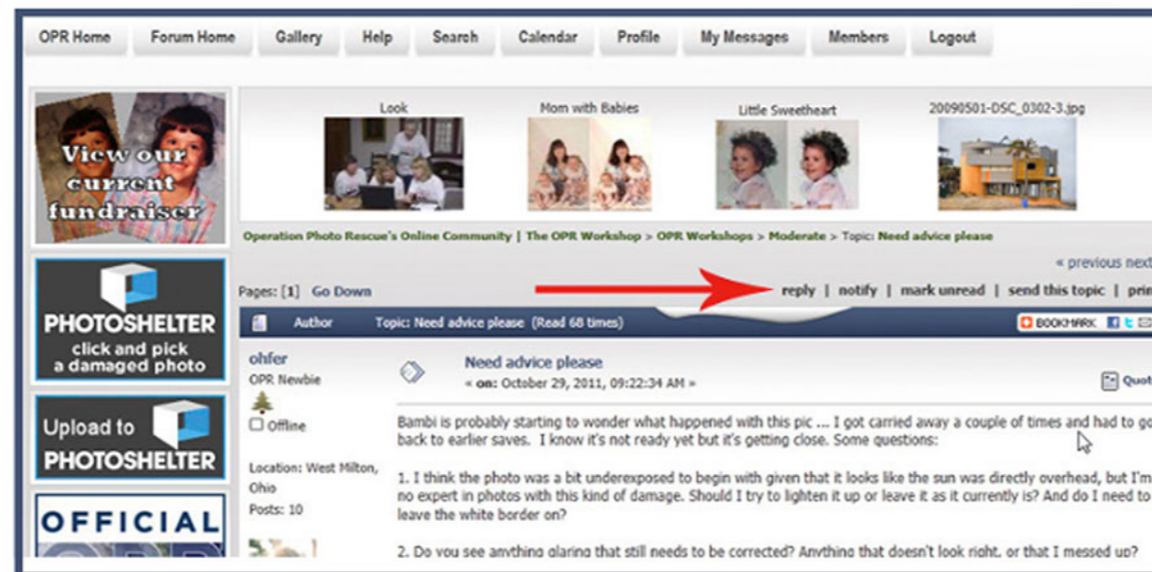
Operation Photo Rescue is seeking new volunteers with an interest in restoring photos.

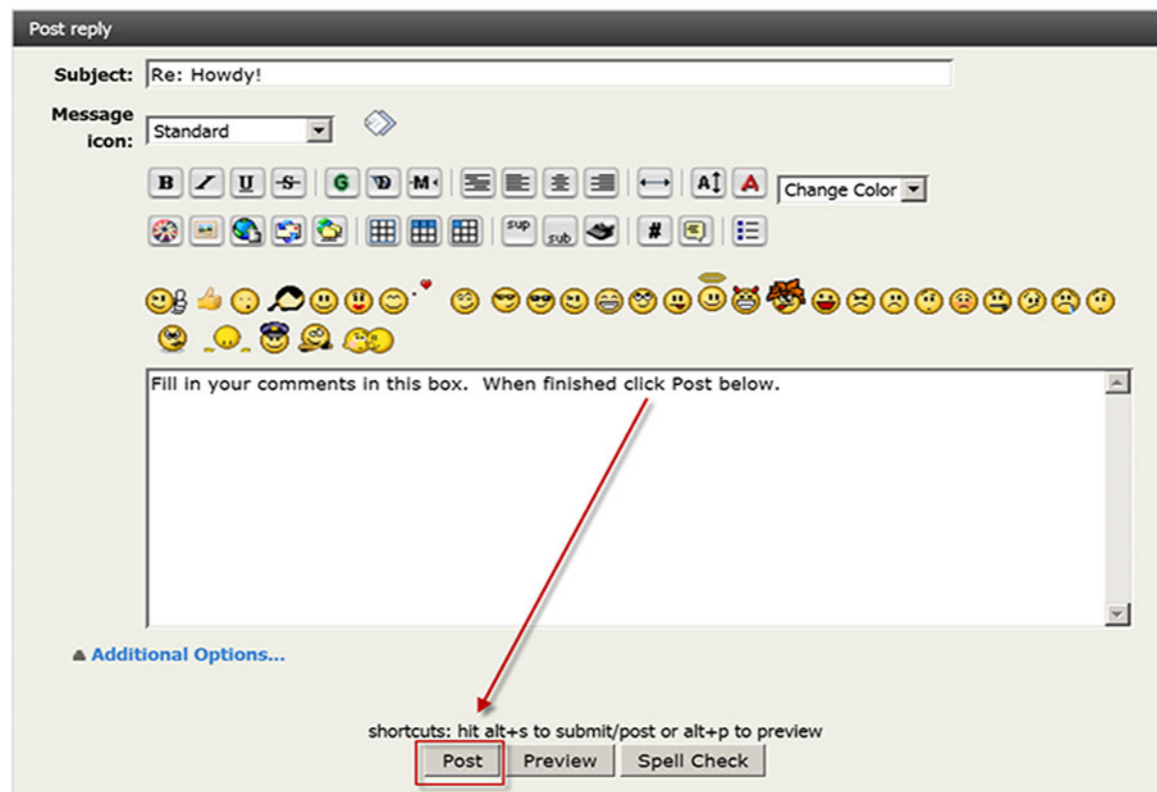

The Forum is a great way to exchange ideas and meet other volunteers. Also, current news appears first on the Forum. To see all the topics and to post, you must be logged in.

1. **Gallery Tab**--Different galleries of before/after photos and also past copy runs.
2. **Help Tab**--Gives helpful tips.
3. **Search Tab**--Locating information.
4. **Calendar**--List volunteer's birthdays.
5. **Profile Tab**--Your profile settings.
6. **My Messages**--Place where you can send/receive private messages from volunteers.
7. **Members Tab**--List members by their user name.



## Posting on the Forum

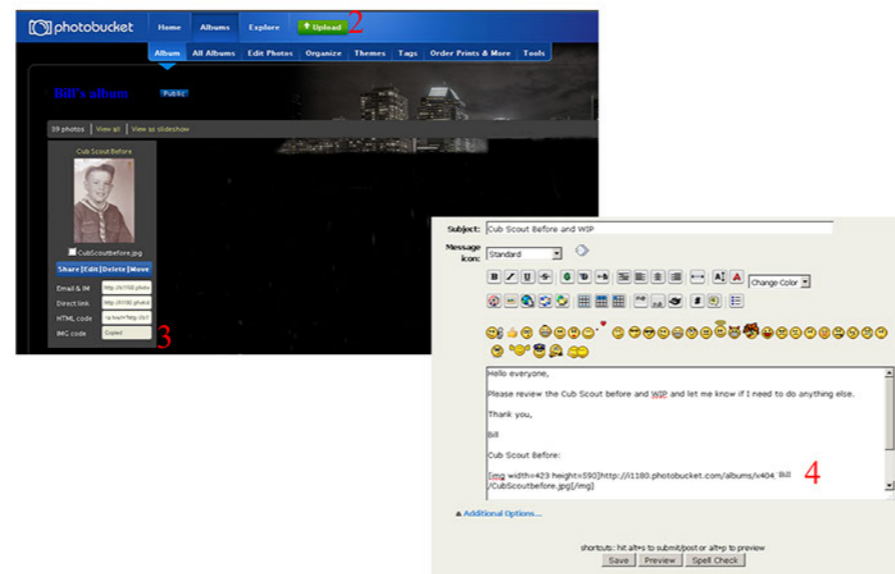
1. Reply to an existing post.

## Adding photos to your Forum Post

1. Sign up and or Sign In to Photobucket - <http://photobucket.com>
2. Upload the photos (original & work in process) from your computer
3. Move your mouse over the photo to select and click on the IMG code to copy
4. Paste the IMG Code into your post.
5. Preview to see how it will display in your post, if satisfied click Send.



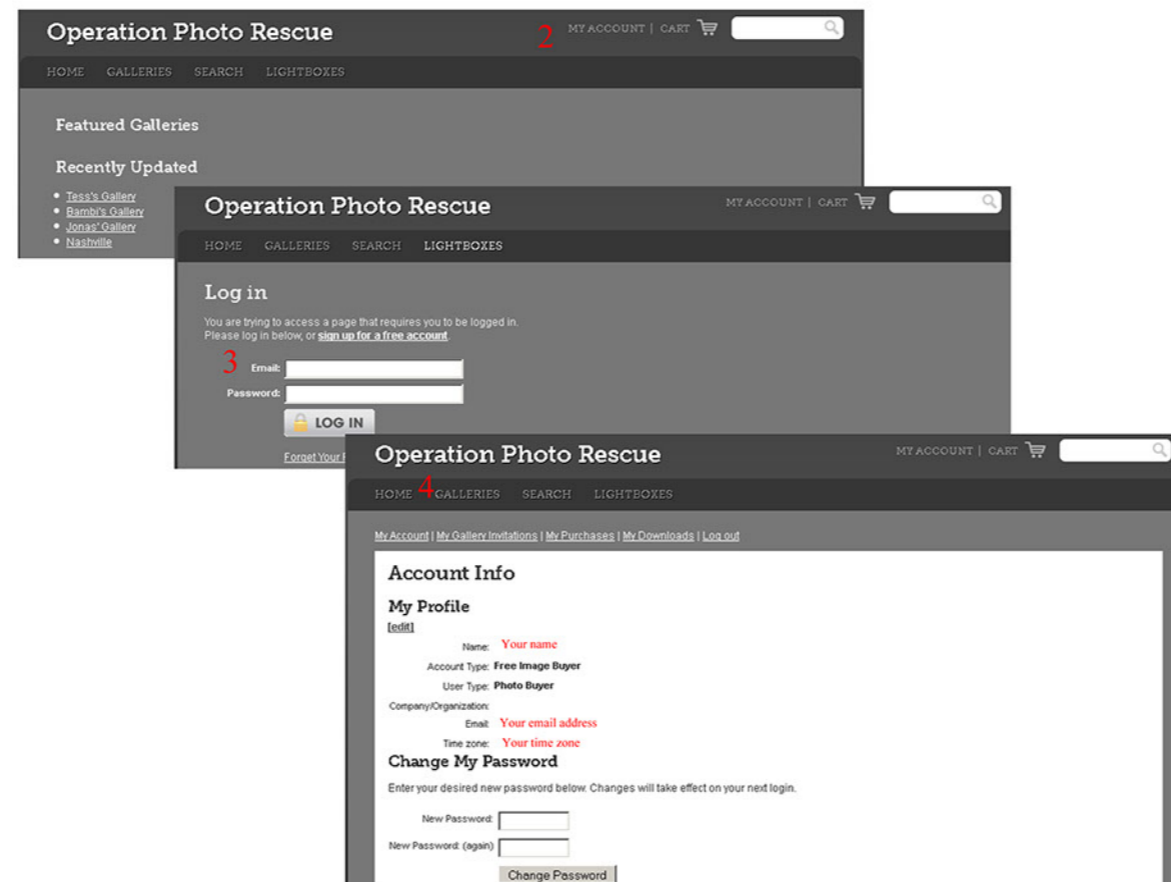

## Photoshelter

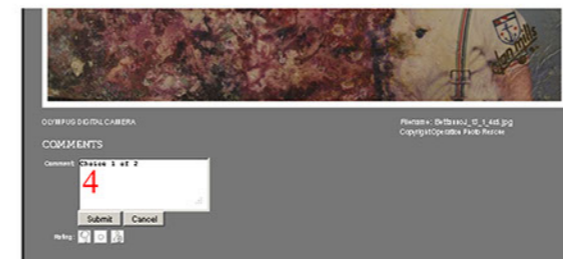
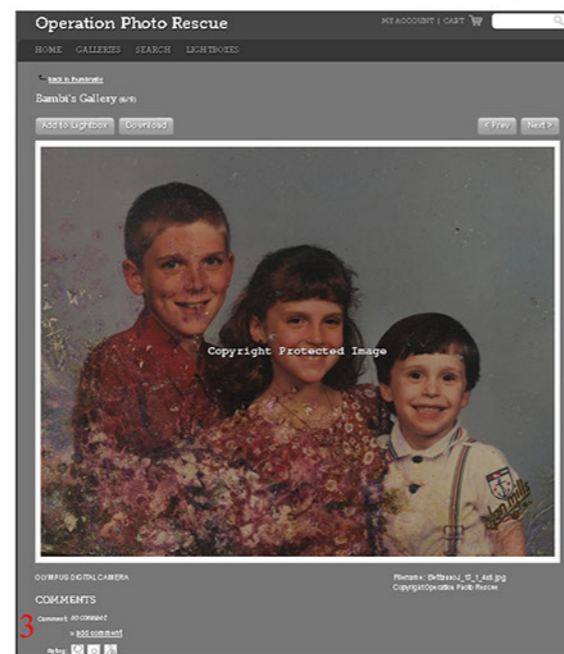
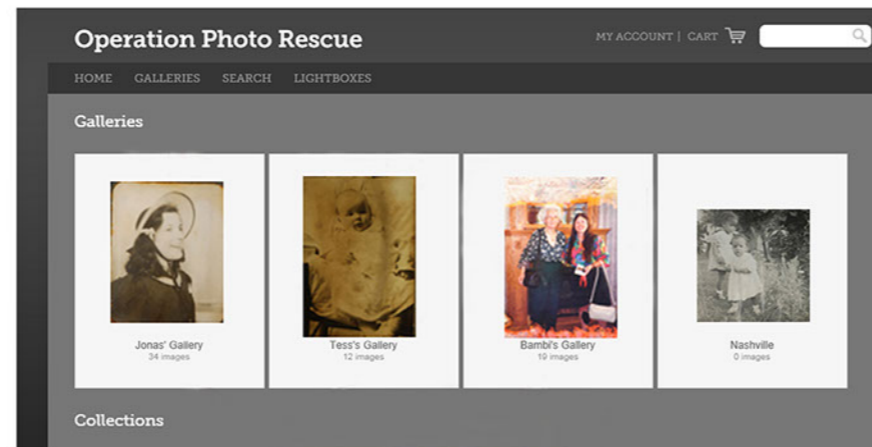
Photoshelter is kind enough to donate space on their web site for OPR to upload and download photos to be restored. Photoshelter does not answer any emails for help! **Please do not send any correspondence to Photoshelter, send it to OPR.**

1. Access the OPR side of Photoshelter at <http://opr.photoshelter.com>
2. Click on My Account to Log In
3. Enter email address and password
4. View the galleries



## Requesting a photo to restore

1. Click on each gallery to review the photos
2. Double click a photo for larger view
3. Request 2 photos from 1 gallery (choice 1 & choice 2) by clicking on “add a comment”
4. Input choice 1 of 2 or choice 2 of 2 in the box and then click submit



## Photoshelter downloads

1. Email invitation link to download from the OPR Gallery Distributor
2. You will be taken to the Photoshelter Log In
3. Click on your photo choice and the download button
4. Always choose the highest resolution which is "Original File"
